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Bertie Bott's Every Flavour Beans Cowl

- Yarn: 100g fingering weight yarn (main colour MC)
2x 20g contrasting mini
- Needles: 3.75 mm circular needles (40 or 60cm cable)
- Hooks: 3.75mm crochet hook (if using the crochet
bobbles method)
- Gauge: 10cm x 10cm - 32 sts x 44 rows
- Notions: Tapestry Needle
Stitch marker
Scissors

Abbreviations:

St(s)	Stitch(es)	CO	Cast on
K	Knit	P	Purl
K2tog	Knit two sts together	Slp1pw	Slip one purlwise
Slp1kw	Slip one knitwise	Kfb	Knit front and back
Sl1pw wyif	Slip one purlwise with yarn in front	SSK	Slip slip knit
RS	Right side of work	WS	Wrong side of work
Rep	Repeat		
Sk2p	Slip next st knitwise onto right needle, K2tog, pass slipped st over st from K2tog		

My inspiration for this pattern was our Stitchcraft & Wizardry colourway "Bertie Bott's Every Flavour Beans". I wanted to knit up a sample of this colourway and turn it into a cowl, and it wouldn't be me, if I didn't come up with a special fun design for it. :-)

At the end of the pattern you will find the notes section where I have included a link to a helpful tutorial, in case you need a little help with your bobbles.

Pattern Directions

CO 135 sts in main colour, place marker for the beginning of the round, and join to close the round.

Ribbing:

Row 1,3, 5 & 7: K all around

Row 2,4,6: P all around

Body:

Row 1: K all around

Row 2: *YO, K3, K2tog*, rep ** all around

Row 3: K all around

Repeat row 2 & 3 nine more times

Change to CC 1

Row 1-3: K all around

Row 4: *K4, bobble*, rep ** all around

Row 5 & 6: K all around

Change to MC

Row 1: K all to last st, 1Kfb (**136 sts**)

Row 2: *K3, P1*, rep ** all around

Row 3: K all around

Row 4: *K1, P1, K2* rep ** all around

Row 5: K all around

Repeat row 2-5 four more times

Change to CC 2

Row 1: Kfb, K to last st, Kfb (**138 sts**)

Row 2: *K1, YO, ssk, K1, K2tog, YO*, rep ** all around

Row 3: K all around

Row 4: *K1, YO, K1, sk2p, K1, YO* rep ** all around

Row 5: K all around

Row 6: K1, K2tog, YO, K1, YO, ssk*, rep ** all around

Row 7: K all around

Row 8: *Sk2p, [K1, YO] twice, K1*, rep ** all around

Row 9: K all around

Change to MC

Row 1: K2tog, K to last 2 sts, K2tog **(136 sts)**

Row 2: *K3, P1*, rep ** all around

Row 3: K all around

Row 4: *K1, P1, K2* rep ** all around

Row 5: K all around

Repeat row 2-5 four more times

Change to CC 1

Row 1: K2tog, K all around **(135 sts)**

Row 2 & 3: K all around

Row 4: *K4, bobble*, rep ** all around

Row 5 & 6: K all around

Change to MC

Row 1: K all around

Row 2: *YO, K3, K2tog*, rep ** all around

Row 3: K all around

Repeat row 2 & 3 nine more times

Ribbing:

Row 1,3, 5 & 7: K all around

Row 2,4,6: P all around

Bind off and weave in ends.

TADAAAAA :-) Your Bertie Bott's Every Flavour Beans Cowl is complete.

Notes:

Bobbles: I personally prefer to make my bobbles using the crochet method. Apart from being a lot less work, they are also a lot fuller and more well rounded, or... well....bobbly! To do this, you will need a 3.5mm crochet hook and do the following:

Insert your hook into the stitch that you would like to create the bobble with,
YO and pull up a loop (1 loop on hook)

YO and insert the hook into the same stitch again

YO and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook)

Repeat until you have 5 or 7 loops on your hook (the more loops, the fuller your bobble will be)
YO and pull through all stitches on your hook
YO and pull through the last loop (to close off your bobble) and place the loop back onto your right needle
Knit the next stitch as normal
